Even small misalignments of the spinal bones can cause big problems with brain-body communication.


Doctors of Chiropractic remove these interferences by gently adjusting the spine to restore proper nerve function and help patients enjoy their full potential for health and optimal performance.

The couple opened their office in Lexington, South Carolina, right after Dr. Sam graduated.


"We've seen great results with so many people in our community and it has been a great fit for our office," said Dr. Joe.


